Pupil premium grant expenditure proposals: Report for parents: 2020/21

What is the pupil premium?

The pupil premium provides school with additional funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils. Pupils were eligible if they were registered as eligible for free school meals, been looked after for 6 months or longer or adopted from care or were service children and attended the school in January 2019.

Key objectives

- to support children in returning to school after Covid-19 lockdown, providing mentoring and nurture based activities as needed.
- to narrow the gap for children in receipt of pupil premium who may have fallen behind or for whom progress has slowed as a result of lockdown
- to improve progress and attainment and narrow the gap in maths and English between non-pupil premium pupils and pupil premium pupils where necessary;

- to improve behaviour and facilitate learning for relevant pupils;
- to facilitate access to extra-curricular and musical activities once they become available again
- to provide additional pastoral support for relevant pupils;
- to further develop engagement, self-belief and facilitate learning for relevant pupils, including those experiencing social and emotional difficulties
- to provide targeted provision for children identified with special educational needs to improve pupil engagement and outcomes.
- to improve attendance
- to improve online access in the case of remote learning

Nature of support

The funding received from Pupil Premium has been allocated in the following ways:

- Provision of teaching assistants' support for targeted support in reading, writing and maths to improve progress and attainment of children in receipt of pupil premium by summer 2021.
- Small group tuition in maths and literacy for some pupils in Key Stage 2 who need targeted support to accelerate their progress, raise attainment and enable them to reach age related expectations by July '21.
- To use RWI spelling and Spelling Shed to continue to improve spelling outcomes for pupils in KS2.
- Continue use of Read Write Inc 1:1 to target support for KS1 and lower KS2 pupils who are in danger of falling behind to close the gap between their current attainment and age related expectations.
- Use of Mathletics and Maths Shed to improve mathematical fluency, offering priority to Mathletics club to pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium.
- Use of Literacy Shed to provide children with a stimulus for writing when needed
- Employment of SEN cluster advisory teacher to offer specialist advice e.g. learning assessments and recommendations for a child's specific next steps, ongoing support for the learning mentor, provision of behaviour and pastoral support plans.
- Payment for all school day trips for pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium when they re-start.
- Provision of one paid for extra curricular club or tuition for one musical instrument per term per pupil in receipt of Pupil Premium (when they re-start), to boost self esteem and increase engagement.
- Provision of nurturing provision to support children with social, mental and emotional health needs, , thereby making them more ready to learn, have more

self-belief and be more engaged in the classroom, ultimately increasing progress.

- Buy-in of support from Warwickshire Attendance Service
- Provision of IT equipment for home use if required.
