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Reading at Home

It is expected that pupils read or are engaged in sharing books for a minimum of 15-30 minutes per day depending on their age. On Monday, books will be available to collect from the main school gate on between 9:30-11:30am for all pupils. We intend for children to collect enough books for 3 weeks so we will offer another opportunity to change books on Monday 1st February. Please ensure all books (even paper copies) are returned to school once they have been read.

Read Write Inc.

Early Readers

We will be providing our children who are currently reading RWI books with the books matched to their current reading abilities. We will be providing packs of RWI home reading books that would usually be read in school. These packs will be for 3 weeks. After this time we will ask you to return these and collect a new set.

As usual, we expect children to read these books three times to develop fluency:

- 1st read – focus on accuracy (decoding)
- 2nd read – read more quickly (fluency)
- 3rd read – develop understanding of what they have read (comprehension)

Early readers will also be able to choose some sharing books to give them access to a range of high quality stories. If you would like to access further reading resources:

Supporting your child using Accelerated Reader

Proficient Readers

Children who are proficient readers are using our Accelerated Reader system to read books matched to their ability and undertake quizzes. We expect children to continue to do this during lock down. Children can come to school and collect books on Monday 11th January between 9:30-11:30am and can be changed in three weeks' time. - All children should know the ZPD level they are working at. If you are unsure about this, please contact your child's class teacher.
- Once your child has read a book they should log on to the Accelerated Reader system to complete a quiz. The quizzes help us and them to see how well they have understood their reading and gain points for their efforts. Scan this QR code with your device's camera, or follow this link to find the quiz:

- Pupils' usernames are their first initial and first three letters of their surname e.g. Sally Smith would be SSMI. Passwords are all set to ABC. If you are unsure of your child's login, please contact your child's class teacher.



Tips for supporting your child's learning at home

- Use www.ARbookfind.co.uk to search for books you may have at home or non-fiction articles your child can read digitally in AR.
- Encourage your child to read for at least 30-minutes every day.
- Talk to your child about their book. Who is their favorite character? What do they predict will happen next?
- Read to your child and listen to them read aloud to you (even strong readers benefit from this time).
- If AR targets are set, support your child by monitoring their progress and providing praise their efforts.

Reminder: While it's important to share reading experiences with children at any age, it is equally important that your child completes their AR quizzes independently so we can effectively monitor their progress and identify areas of need that we can address.

If your child requires help on a quiz, consider the following:

- Asking your child to read the question aloud to you.
- Rewording the question for your child.
- Asking your child which answers are NOT correct.
- Encouraging your child to share a daily update with you when reading their next book. Thank you for all you are doing to support your child's reading growth.
