## Sport premium grant expenditure review: Report for parents: 2017/18

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Kineton Primary School received a grant of £17520 for primary school sports in the academic year 2017-18. The money was used in a number of different ways to support the provision of improved quality of sports, PE and healthy lifestyle for all pupils.

## The impact of sport premium spending

### **Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity**

Funding has been enabled the purchase of large pieces of outdoor activity equipment. These are used daily to provide children with a variety of physical challenges to develop balance, upper and lower body strength and hand strength. They also encourage cooperation, competition, and imaginative play, developing communication skills and confidence through teamwork and fun.

### **Key indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement**

The school's five year strategic plan focuses on the pupils' increased use of the outdoors to encourage the use of physical activity across the curriculum. An outdoor wooded area has been cleared and is available for use along with our extensive school grounds. Some equipment has been purchased.

### **Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport**

Key Stage 1 staff were able to work alongside cricket coaches to develop knowledge of the game and coaching techniques for cricket skills in young children. Staff have received training in how to lead children in outdoor activities such as den building and fire making. Staff have received swimming pool management training.

### **Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils**

Year 1 and 2 took part in 'All Stars Cricket', receiving coaching from visiting professionals and several children went on to join the local cricket club. Children are participating in more physical activities across the curriculum in line with our five year strategic plan.

### **Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport**

Key Stage pupils took part in a range of competitive opportunities. As a school, we choose to offer all children the opportunity to participate over time. Events this year included:

- Sports day including competitive track events
- Interschool football tournament
- Sports Hall athletics
- Quad Kids Athletics
- Interschool rounders competition
