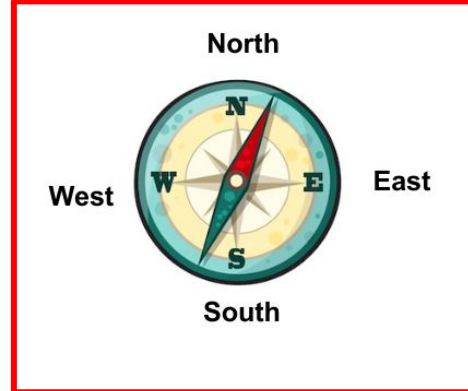
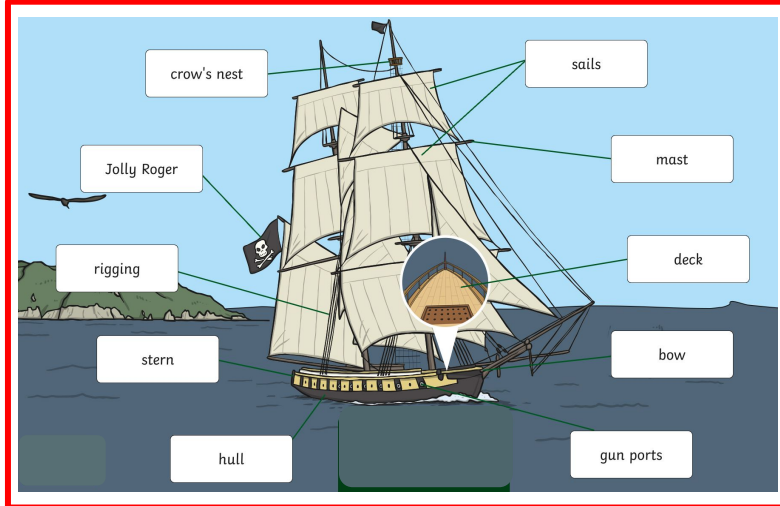

Vocabulary List

pirate	sailor who attacks other ships and steals their property
map	diagram of an area of land and sea
map key	table that explains the symbols on a map
human features	things made by humans e.g. city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop
physical features	things that are natural e.g. beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather
cliff	a steep rock face at the edge of the sea
coast	the part of land near the sea
valley	low area of land between 2 hills
vegetation	plants found in a habitat
port	a town with a harbour
harbour	A safe place where you can keep a boat
