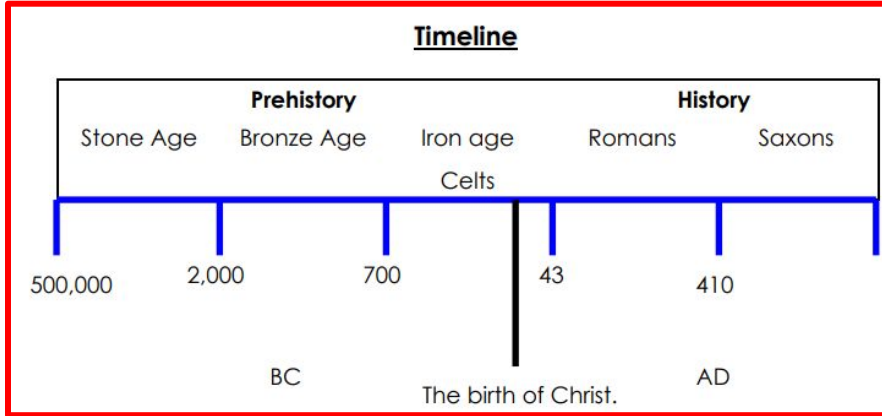


# Knowledge Organiser: Stone Age to Iron Age Through the Ages

## Important Places

**Skara Brae** is a stone-built Neolithic settlement, located on the island of Orkney situated off the north coast of Scotland.



**Stonehenge** is a prehistoric monument in Wiltshire, England. It consists of a ring of standing stones, with each standing stone around 13 feet high, 7 feet wide and weighing around 25 tons.



## Key Vocabulary

Stone Age	The name given to the earliest period of human culture when stone tools were first made.
Bronze Age	The time period when bronze replaced stone as the preferred material for making tools and weapons.
Iron Age	The time period when iron became the preferred choice of metal for making tools.
Neolithic	The latest part of the Stone Age. It is when farming began and when people started caring for animals such as cows, sheep and pigs.
Forage	To go from place to place to search for food to eat.
Thatched	A roof that has been made of straw or reeds.
Prehistoric	The time before history was written down.
Monument	A group of huge stones, often set up in a line or circle.
Tribe	A group of people who lived in the same area and did similar things.
