



# **Charging and Remissions Policy**

## **1. INTRODUCTION**

The Headteacher and Governing Board of Kineton C.E. Primary School recognise the value of providing a wide range of experiences to enrich and extend pupils' learning and to contribute to their personal development. The Head Teacher and Governing Board aim to promote and provide such experiences for the pupils of the school, both as part of a broad and balanced curriculum and as additional optional activities.

However, many of these activities have an associated cost and cannot be provided unless voluntary contributions are received or parents are charged for the cost.

This policy will set out the circumstances in which charges will or will not be made for school activities and when charges may be waived in order to ensure that all pupils have an equal opportunity to benefit from school visits, curricular and extra-curricular activities.

## **2. STATEMENT:**

Our policy complies with the requirements of the Education Act 1996 and where 'parent' is referred to this will include adults with a legal responsibility for the pupil including 'carer'.

We aim:-

- To make school activities accessible to all pupils regardless of family income
- To encourage and promote external activities which give added value to the curriculum
- To provide a process which allows activities to take place at a minimum cost to parents, pupils and the school
- To respond to the wide variations in family income while not adding additional unexpected burdens to the school budget

### **1. Admissions**

There is no charge for admissions.

### **2. School meals**

There is no charge for children who are entitled to free school meals or infant free school meals. Pupils who are not entitled to free school meals will be charged a set amount per meal decided by the school.

### **3. Public examinations**

There is no charge for examinations that are part of the curriculum and on the school's set examinations list, where children have been prepared for the examinations by the school.

#### **4. Activities that take place during school hours (this does not include the break in the middle of the school day)**

There is no charge for activities during school hours with the exception of music tuition (**section 8**).

- There is no charge for transport during school hours to other premises where the local authority or governing board has arranged for the pupil to be provided with education.

#### **We may charge for:**

- books and materials that the parent wishes the child to keep (the cost will be made clear to the parents before charge)
- optional extras (**section 5**)
- music or vocal tuition (**section 8**).

#### **5. Activities that take place outside school hours (non-residential)**

There is no charge for activities that take place outside school hours when they are:

- part of the set curriculum
- part of the school's basic curriculum for religious education.

#### **Optional extras**

The school will charge for optional extras. Optional extras include:

- education provided outside school time that is **not**:
  - a) part of the National Curriculum
  - b) part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the school
  - c) part of religious education
- examination entry fee(s) if the registered pupil has not been prepared for the examination(s) at the school
- transport that is not taking the pupil to school or to other premises where the local authority or governing body has arranged for the pupil to be provided with education.
- board and lodging for a pupil on a residential visit.
- visits to museums;
- sporting activities which require transport expenses;
- cooking;
- outdoor adventure activities;
- visits to or by a theatre company;
- musical events.

#### **The cost of optional extras**

The head teacher will decide when it is necessary to charge for optional activities. Any charge made in respect of individual pupils will not exceed the actual cost of providing the optional extra activity, divided equally by the number of pupils participating. In no circumstances will there be an element of subsidy required for any pupils wishing to participate in the activity whose parents are unwilling or unable to pay the full charge (**section 12**).

When calculating the cost of optional extras an amount may be included in relation to:

- any materials, books, instruments or equipment provided in connection with the optional extra
- non-teaching staff
- teaching staff engaged under contracts for services purely to provide an optional extra, including supply teachers engaged specifically to provide the optional extra
- the cost, or a proportion of the costs, for teaching staff employed to provide tuition in playing a musical instrument, where the tuition is an optional extra.

Participation in any optional extra activity will be on the basis of parental choice and a willingness to pay the charges. The school will need to have the agreement of parents before organising the provision of an optional extra where charges will be made.

## **6. Activities that take place *partly* during school hours either on or off site**

Where the majority of a non-residential activity takes place during school hours the charging of the activity will be the same as is outlined in **section 4**. Travelling time is included in time spent on the activity.

If the school organises a residential visit in school time, mainly made up of activities such as outdoor adventure activities, this would require voluntary contributions from parents. Parents unable or unwilling to pay these voluntary contributions should contact their child's class teacher or Head Teacher in the first instance to discuss their position.

In cases where the majority of a non-residential activity takes place outside school hours the charge cannot include the cost of alternative provision for those pupils who do not wish to participate. So no charge can be made for supply teachers to cover for those teachers who are absent from school accompanying pupils on a visit.

In this case the charging of the activity will be the same as is outlined in **section 5**.

## **7. Residential activities**

**Our school will not charge for:**

- education provided on any visit that takes place during school hours

- education provided on any visit that takes place outside school hours if it is part of the National Curriculum, or part of a syllabus for a prescribed public examination that the pupil is being prepared for at the school, or part of religious education
- supply teachers to cover for those teachers who are absent from school accompanying pupils on a residential visit

### **Our school will charge for:**

#### **Board and lodging**

When any visit has been organised by the school where there may be a cost for board and lodging, parents will be informed of this before the visit takes place. We will charge up to the full cost of board and lodging on residential visits, whether it is classified as taking place during school hours or not. The charge will not exceed the actual cost. Parents who can prove they are in receipt of certain benefits or whose child is in receipt of the pupil premium may request a school subsidy of this cost (see section 11 for more guidance on remissions).

#### **Travel**

Travel charges may apply when the residential activity takes place outside school hours. The amount charged will be calculated to cover the unit cost per pupil. These charges may not apply to those pupils entitled to remissions, but no other pupils will be charged extra to cover those costs.

#### **Activities**

The school may charge for residential activities that fall **outside** school hours (**see section 5**).

### **8. Music tuition within school hours**

Kineton C.E. Primary School follows government legislation that states that all education provided during school hours must be free; however, music lessons are an exception to this rule.

**Charges will be made if** the teaching is **not** an essential part of either the National Curriculum or a public examination syllabus being followed by the pupil(s).

The school may charge for teaching requested by parents and delivered by specialist tutors given to either an individual pupil or groups of any appropriate size (provided that the size of the group is based on sound pedagogical principles) to play a musical instrument or to sing. The cost of these lessons may depend on the size and duration of the class as well as the type of instrument.

The school will not charge if the music tuition is part of the National Curriculum.

Kineton C.E. Primary School is dedicated to ensuring equal opportunities for all pupils including access to specialised music tuition, therefore charges made for music tuition within school hours may be remitted for pupils on income related free school meals.

## **9. Extended services**

Kineton C.E. Primary School is dedicated to providing a well-rounded and extensive education for our students which includes a wide range of extra-curricular activities. Our school aims to provide:

- high-quality learning opportunities at the end of the school day including a range of extra-curricular activities
- ways of improving outcomes and narrowing gaps in outcomes between different groups of pupils.

Where a charge is made, the total charge will not exceed the cost of providing the activity and no parent will be asked to subsidise others. Independent external providers will determine their own charges.

## **10. Damage to property and breakages**

Where school property has been wilfully or recklessly damaged by a student, the school may charge those responsible for some or all of the cost of repair or replacement.

Where property belonging to a third party has been damaged by a pupil, and the school has been charged, the school may charge some or all of the cost to those responsible.

Whether or not these charges will be made will be decided by the head teacher and dependent on the situation.

## **11. Remissions and concessions**

The school will give consideration to the remission of charges to parents or carers whose children are eligible for the income based pupil premium. Parents who are eligible for the remission of charges will be dealt with confidentially.

The head teacher and chair of governors will authorise the remission of charges.

The school may choose to subsidise part or all of the payment of some charges for certain activities and pupils, and this will be determined by the governing board and head teacher.

## **12. Voluntary contributions**

The Governing Board may ask for voluntary contributions to the school for general funds and/or to fund activities that will enrich our pupils' education.

In any case where an activity cannot be afforded without voluntary funding, this will be made clear to the parents by the school. If the activity is cancelled all monies paid will be returned to parents.

There is no obligation for a parent or carer to make any contribution and the school will not pressure parents to make a contribution.

### **13. Inability or unwillingness to pay**

Kineton C.E. Primary School is committed to ensuring fair access and treatment of all pupils, and this means ensuring that no child is excluded from an activity because the parents or carers of that child are unwilling or unable to pay. If there is insufficient funding for an activity, then it will be cancelled.

The identity of the child or parents of the child who did not want to make the payment, or could not make the payment, will not be disclosed.
